EDEC 3302 is an immersive early practicum experience that provides teacher candidates with the opportunity to apply their theoretical knowledge in real classroom settings. Through observation, interaction, and reflective practice, candidates will develop the skills, attitudes, and competencies necessary to become effective early childhood educators who can create engaging and developmentally appropriate learning environments for young children. This course is a critical step toward preparing teacher candidates for the challenges and rewards of a career in education.
