They explore strategies for differentiation to meet the diverse needs of students, cultivate classroom management techniques, and refine their abilities to create inclusive and equitable learning environments. In alignment with the established standards for teacher preparation, EDEL 4311 emphasizes reflective practice as a cornerstone of professional growth. Preservice teachers engage in ongoing self-reflection and collaborate with mentor teachers to continually refine their instructional approaches.
